

LEGUARD SHADLOW

Born February 11, 1904 in Okmulgee, Oklahoma. Lived in Oklahoma until 1919. Resided in Kansas City from then until 1921. To Chicago one year then back to Kansas City where he served four years in prison for Bank Robbery. Came back to Chicago in 1925. January 18, 1929 was indicted for robbery of Franklin State Bank, 35 Michigan. Avenue. Was convicted in January 1930, Cock County Jail. Through the Sunday Services held in jail and the many kind Christian workers, who called on him, during the week Shadlow also confessed to me on October 1st that Leon Brown was not with them in said Bank Robbery. He also so said the fifth man had not as yet been apprehended by the police. He told me that he had prayed over the advise we give him on Monday and had fully made his mind to tell the assistant Warden the truth about Brown.

He said the reason he had not confessed was because Leon's Brother, LaSalle Brown had so many good friends that as long as they did not know the truth about Brown, hot being in the robbery, that he and Lafon could get a break and have life like the other three boys and after they get their sentence then they infiended to make a statement like Dixon and Jenkins, then his brother could get him out of the pen. He told me that if a reprieve did not come he would tell the warden the tmmth.
